Before the undersigned authority personally appeared J. T. Rape who is known to me and who, being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says:

I was acquainted with Mr. J. A. Rector to whom D. W. Crane and wife made a deed on the 26th day of May 1927, which is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 79 page 441. Immediately after the execution and delivery of the aforementioned deed, Mr. Rector moved his family on the property and remained living upon said property with his family, cultivating it or having portions of it cultivated every year until he died, and thereafter his widow, Mrs. J. A. Rector and his three children remained in possession of it, cultivating or having portions of it cultivated each and every year until they deeded it to Clarence C. Lance on the 11th day of November, 1940. Mr. Rector left surviving him his widow, Mrs. J. A. Rector, and three children, who were his sole heirs at law and next of kin, and their names are correctly set out in the deed of Mrs. J. A. Rector and others to Clarence C. Lance, dated November 11, 1940, and recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 109 page 426. I was well and intimately acquainted with the Rector Family, and worked with them on the farm about four years.

Said J. A. Rector has been dead ten years or more.
