## AFFIDAVIT

Shaw, who being duly sworn depose and say that they reside in Shelby County, Alabama; that for a period of more than 50 years last past they have been acquainted with the location, description, boundaries use, parties in possession and the owners of the following described land situated in Shelby County, Alabama to wit:

The South East quarter of the South East quarter of section 31 township 19, range 1 East; also all that part of the South West Quarter of Section 32, township 19, Range 1
