Before the undersigned authority personally appeared John W. Ozley, who is known to me and who being by me first duly sworn deposes and says:

I am acquainted with the following described real estate situated in Shelby County, Alabama, viz:

Start at the NW corner of the SW 1/4 of Section 17 Tp. 21, Range 2 West and run south 43 deg. 45' east 29 feet for point of beginning, thence along a fence line S 88 deg 10' E 2616 feet to point of half section line of section 17, thence along said half section line south 2 deg 15' E 1051 feet, thence south 49 deg 45' W along north boundary of old tram road 400 feet, thence S 61 deg 45' W 214.4 feet, thence continue along said tram line S 70 deg 45' W 1246.3 feet to east line of Birmingham-Montgomery Highway, thence N 38 deg 45' West along said highway 340 feet, thence north 28 deg. west 1625 feet, thence north 1 deg 20' west 245.3 feet to the point of beginning, and all situated in the SW 1/4 of Section 17, Township 21, Range 2 West, and containing 84 acres, more or less.

I have known this land for thirty-five years or more. In 1916 J. Beecher Adams, who is the same person as JamesB. Adams, and also the same as J.B. Adams, deeded this and other property to Longview Bime Works, a corporation. This deed is dated March 3, 1916, and recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 60 at page 109. The Longview Lime Works went into possession of the land described in said deed, including the above described land immediately on the execution of said deed, and remained in possession of the same and cultivated portions of it or had it cultivated continuously until the Longview Lime Works deeded it to J. Beecher Adams by deed dated September 20, 1934, and recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 91 at page 497. About that time Longview Lime Works was dissolved and J.B. Adams deeded the property to Longview Saginaw Lime Works, Inc., a corporation, by deed dated October 11, 1934, which deed is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 98 page 29. Said J.B. Adams had portions of it cultivated from the time it was deeded to him until he deeded it to Longview-Saginaw Lime Works. Longview-Saginaw Lime Works went into possession of said property on the execution of the last above named deed and had portion of it cultivated continuously until it deeded the same to Elley M. Snow and wife, Ruth C. Snow by deed dated May 29, 1946, which deed is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in deed book 126 at page 495.

During all of the time aforementioned, the possession of the various owners was actual open, notorious, continuous, exclusive and adverse, with portions of said land cultivated each and every year.
