KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That in consideration of One Hundred Dollars and other good and valuable consideration, to the undersigned grantors, Flora Johnson, a widow; Frances Johnson Wooley and husband, Mose Wooley; JamesCharles Johnson, a single man; June Johnson Lovelady and husband Wesley Lovelady, the sole and surviving heirs at law of James A. Johnson, deceased, in hand paid by George C. Lehaman and V erna B. Lehman, the receipt whereof is acknowledged we the said Flora Johnson, a widow; Frances Johnson Wooley and husband, Mose Wooley; James Charles Johnson, a single man; June Johnson Lovelady and husband, Wesley Lovelady, do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said George C. Lehman and Verna B. Lehman as joint tenants, with right of survivorship, the following described real estate, situated in Shelby County, Alabama, to-wit:

Begin at a point on the south line of Alabama Highway No. 25 where the same crosses the west line of N_2^1 of SW_4^1 of NE_4^1 of Section 4, Township 24, Range 13 East and run in an easterly direction along said highway line 200 feet; thence south, and parallel with the west line of said twenty acres, 470 feet; thence west 200 feet to the west line of said twenty acres; thence along same north 470 feet to the point of beginning; being situated in the N_2^1 of SW_4^1 of NE_4^2 of Section 4, Township 24, Range 13 East, Shelby County, Alabama.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD unto the said George C. Lehman and Verna B. Lehman, as joint tenants, with right of survivorship, their heirs and assigns forever; it being the intention of the parties to this conveyance, that (unless the joint tenancy hereby created is severed or terminated during the joint lives of the grantees herein) in the event one grantee herein survives the other, the entire interest in fee simple shall pass to the surviving grantee, and one grantee does not survive the other, then the heirs and assigns of the grantees herein shall take as tenants in common.
