I know that the said Letha Brasher Parker has been dead for several years and that there was no issue ever born to the said Ben Parker.

I know that the said S. T. Parker had five children born to him by his second wife. They were M. D. Parker, W. A. Parker, Earlie Parker, Elvie Parker, all of whom are still living and who are well known to me, the fifth child, a daughter, Vera Parker Lynn, who died about the year 1938. She was married to Ellis Lynn and had one child, a daughter, Zenobie Maybell Lynn, who is now about 9 years of age. I know of my own knowledge that the above described persons are all the heirs at law of the said S. T. Parker. I know that the first wife of the said S. T. Parker died prior to the year 1919 and that the second wife of the said S. T. Parker was named Mary Elizabeth Parker and that she died about the year 1933.

I am well acquainted with the following described real estate, situated in Shelby County, Alabama, to-wit:
