All that part or parcel of the Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter, lying East and North of the Central of Georgia Railroad, and all that part of the North half of the Southeast Quarter lying North of the Central of Georgia Railroad, all in Section 24, Township 18, Range 1 East. containing 32 acres more ix or less.

I am a son of W.H. White who died intestate about the year 1935 and at that time the sole heirs at law and next of kin entitled to share in the distribution of the estate were his children; W.B. White, a son; affiant T. G. White, a son; Georgia Coddell, a daughter and whose husband was Ben Coddell; Liela also known as Leila Milam, a daughter whose husband was Juston Milan; Ozley White, a son who was unmarried on the 21st day of February, 1938. Said W.H. White left surviving him his widow Lillie White.

My father obtained title to all that part of the Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter, Section 24, Towsnship 18, Range 1 East which lies east and north of the Central of Georgia Railroad in Shelby County, Alabama, by deed from R.H. Jarrett, as Administrator of the estate of J.M. White, deceased, dated February, 4, 1911 and recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama in Deed Book 76 at page 225.

Immediately after the execution of said last mentioned deed said W.H. White moved on said land, cleared most of it up and remained in actual, open, notorious, continuous, exclusive, adverse possession of it, living upon it and cultivating portions of it each and every year until the time of his death.

Said W.H. White purchased from C.W. Wood on the 9th day of January, 1917 all that part of the North half of the Southeast Quarter of said Section 24, Township 18, South, Range 1 East, lying North of the Central of Georgia Railroad. He prowured a deed from said C.W. Wood at that time which is recorded in the Probate office of Shelby County, Alabama in Deed Book 129 at page 111.

Immediately after the execution of the last mentioned deed the said W.H. White went into possession of said tract of land therein conveyed, cleared up portions of it and remained in actural, open, notorious continuous, exclusive, adverse possession of it and cultivating portions of it each and every year up until STATE OF ALABAMA SHELBY COUNTY the time of his death.
