operating, repairing, removing and/or replacing one or more pipe lines for the transportation of gas and/or
any and all other substances, and all appliances and appurtenances deemed by grantee necessary or desirable
underground, in, under, or upon the following described lands of the grantors located in Shelby County,
Alabama, to-wit:

South East Quarter of South West Quarter and all that part of the South West Quarter of the South East

Quarter lying South and West of the L. & N. Railroad and South and East of Buck Creek all in Section

Fourteen Township Twenty South, Range Three West and is govered by a deed made by O. G. Denson and wife

Veda Denson made to Stephen A. D. McGuire recorded Vol 18 page 364 and 365, record of Deeds, Shelby County,

and Thomas B. Miller and wife to Stephen ArdD. McGuire recorded in Vol. 19 page 52, and 53 record of

Deeds Shelby County, excepting that land as deeded to Frank McGuire by Stephen A. D. McGuire under the

deed now held by Frank McGuire, situated in Pelham Shelby County, Alabama, being the same land acquired

and more fully described as per deed of record in Book 80 page 7 of records of Shelby County, Alabama.

Together with all other rights and privileges necessary for convenient for the full enjoyment of use of the rights herein granted, including, but without limiting the same to, the free right of egress and ingrees, over and across said lands for the purpose aforesaid, together with the right, from time to time, to cut and keep clear all trees, undergrowth and other obstructions that may injure or endanger any of said lines.

Grantee agrees that, subject to engineering or construction difficulties, the first pipe line laid shall be laid as nearly as reasonably feasible in or adjacent to the old ditch in which the former line of Southern Natural Cas Company was laid.
