I am acquainted with the E¹ of the SE¹ of Section 2, Township 24, Range 13 East, and have known it for thirty-five or forty years or more.

For many years I was agent of John S. Storrs and the John S. Storrs estate, to which this eighty acre tract of land belongs. All of said eighty is fenced up and has been for thirty years or more, and has been in the possession of John S. Storrs and after his death, in possession of his heirs at law, during all of that while. During part of that time, portions of it was cultivated by tenants of Storrs and the balance of the time it has been in pasture and used by such tenants.

Just a few years ago Storrs' heirs sold the timber on this property to W. P. Brown and Sons Lumber Company. This was in 1940, and said W. P. Brown and Sons Lumber Company cut the timber from the entire eighty acres. No part of said eighty lies north of the railroad and during none of the time aforementioned has Alabama Lime and Stone Corporation, H. L. Grim, Ida Johnson, Twin Oaks Land Company, Willie L. Chambliss or A. S. Davidson, had any actual possession to said property.
