White and James White, and that the said James White died about one year after the death of his father, Thomas R. White, and that he was not married and had no lineal descendants. And that the widow, L.E. White now resides in the City of Bessemer Alabama, and one son, John S. White, lives in the city of Bessemer, Alabama, and that the other son, William A. White, resides in Greenwick Village, Massachusetts, and that both of the sons are married and have living wives, and that the widow, L.E. White, and William A. White, in hand paid by L.E. White the receipt whereof is acknowledged we the said John S. White and wife, Mary White, and William A. White and wife, Sue F. White, do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said L.E. White the following described real estate, to-wit:

Section 6, Township 21, Range 4 West,
situated in Shelby County, Alabama.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, to the said L.E. White, her heirs and assigns forever.

And we do for ourselves and for our heirs, executors and administrators, covenant with the said L.E. White her heirs and assigns, that we are lawfully seized in fee simple of said premises; that they are free from all encumbrances; that we have a good right to sell and convey the same as aforesaid; that we will, and our heirs, executors and administrators shall, warrant and defend the same to the said L.E. White, her heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims of all persons.
