

AFFIDAVIT

Before the undersigned authority personally appeared Thomas Minor who is known to me and who being by me first duly sworn deposes and says:

I am acquainted with the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter, Section 26, Township 21, Range 1 West, Shelby County, Alabama, and have known said land between forty and forty-five years.

In 1907 I purchased a home just north of the Tuscaloosa Road and lived there on that property about twenty-five years. I am acquainted with what is known as the Gat^{Harkins} Lot and Amos Acker lot. The Amos Acker Lot was one acre wide north and south and laid between my lot and the Gat Harkins Lot. Mrs. W.B. Brown owned the entire forty north of the road except one acre across the south side adjoining the road on the north. Her heirs later sold to Annie Pope one lot just north of the Gat Harkins Lot. I do not know how long Mrs. W.B. Brown has been dead but she was in possession of the property above described, with the exception noted, for at least twenty years prior to her death and after her death her heirs at law have been in possession of same. I do not know the names of all the Brown heirs. Some of them are dead but they do now own that portion of said forty described as follows:

Begin at the point where the Western line of said forty intersects the South right-of-way line of the Southern Railroad, thence along the West line of said forty South 1 degree, 51 minutes East, 257.6 feet to the Northwest corner of the present Annie Pope lot; thence North 79 degrees 13 minutes East, 210 feet; thence North 1 degree 51 minutes West, 374.3 feet, to the South right-of-way line of the Southern Railroad; thence along the South right-of-way line of said railroad, South 53 degrees 14 minutes West, 253.7 feet, to the point of beginning.

Said Mrs. W.B. Brown and her heirs after her death have been in the undisputed actual, open, notorious, exclusive, adverse possession of the property last above described for the last forty or forty-five years. I cultivated this portion of the land and other lands owned by Mrs. W.B. Brown many years ago. This was probably fifteen or twenty years ago. I know of others who have rented it from the Browns and have cultivated it.
