To all to whom these presents shall come, Greetings:

WHEREAS, Hannah Frost of Shelby County has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuskaloosa in Alabama

whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Hannah Frost according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820, entitled "An act making further provisions for the sale of of the Public Lands", for the West half of the North east quarter of section Eleven of Township twenty two of Range three west in the District of Tuskaloosa and State of Alabama, containing seventy nine acres, and Sixty eight hundredths of an acre,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Hannah Frost.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted and, by these presents to give and grant, unto the said Hannah Frost the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereto belonging, unto the said Hannah Frost and her heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I James Monroe, President of the United States of America, have cuased these letters to be made Fatent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington D.C. the second day of June in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty three, and of the Independence of the United States the forty seventh.
