WHEREAS, Charles L. Matthews of Oglethorpe Georgia has deposited in the General Land office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuskaloosa, Alabama, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Charles L. Matthews according to the provisions of the Act of Bongress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provisions for the sale of the Public Lands" for the East half of the Northeast quarter of Section Eleven, of township twenty two, of Range Three (West) in the District of Tuskaloosa and State pf Alabama, containing Seventy nine acres and Sixty eight hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Charles L. Matthews

NOW KNOWN YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided have Given and Granted, and by these presents fo give and grant, into the said Charles L. Matthews the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the

same, together with all of the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Charles L. Matthews and his heirs and assigns forever.

In tiestimony whereof, I, James Monroe, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made fatent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereby affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, The second day of June, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty three, and of the independence of the United States the forty seventy.
