WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States "Warrant No. 10514 for 40 acres, issued in favor of William Blackerby, Corporal in Captain Young's Company Alabama Volunteers Creek War, has been returned to the General Land Office, with eivdence that the same has been duly loacted upon the Southwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section Nineteen, in Township Twenty of Range One West in the District of Lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, containing thirty nine acres and eighty one and a half hundredths of an acre

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is thereforegranted by the United States unto the said William Blackerby the tract of land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said William Blackerby and to his heirs and assigns forever,

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I, Millard Fillmore, President of the United States of America, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
