TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

WHEREAS, William Armstrong of Shelby County, Alabama, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa, whereby it appear that full payment has been made by the said Willia, Armstrong according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 2820, entitled "An act making further provisions for the sale of the Public Lands" for the Northwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section Nineteen, in Township Twenty of Range One West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, containing thirty nine acres, and eighty one and a half hundredths of an acre;

according to the official plan of the Survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said William Armstrong.

NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, Have Given and Granted, and by these presents do Give and Grant, unto the said William Armstrong and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To Have and To Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said William Armstrong and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I Franklin Pierce, President of the United States of America, have caused these Letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
