Personally came and appeared before me, S.A. Lokey, a notary public in and for State of Alabama at Large, J.W. Moore, Jr., who after being first by me duly sworn according to law to speak the truth, deposes and says:

My name is J.W. Moore. I use the Jr., after my name and have for many years to designate me from another J.W. Moore in the same community, although my father's initials were not J.W. I am 70 years of age and have known the hereinafter described property all of my life, to-wit:

The West half of the Southwest quarter of Section 33, Township 19, Range 1 East, and all that part of the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter of Section 33, Township 19, Range 1 East lying West of the Columbiana-Westover Road, situated in Shelby County, Alabama.

When I was a small boy, my father, R.B. Moore purchased this land from my grandfather, H.G. Moore, (it has always been my understanding that my grandfather bought it from Mr. Amos Daniels, but this I do not know of my own personal knowledge). My father moved on above described land after buying it from my grandfather about the year 1888 and lived thereon, cultivating part, pasturing part and in every way used it as a farm and homestead until his deathabout the year 1908. My father died intestate leaving surviving him, his widow, Mrs. Carrie Moore and the following, who were his sole heirs at law, viz: Affiant, J.W. Moore, Jr., Mrs. Florence Vick, Arthur Moore, J.R. Moore, Amos Moore and Coly Moore, children living at that time, and Terrance W. Moore and Zena Moore, who later married Willie Bell, all of the children of B.W. Moore, a son of R.B. Moore, who had died prior to the death of the said R.B. Moore.

After my father's death, his widow, the said Mrs. Carrie Moore and my brothers, Arthur Moore, Amose Moore and Coly Moore lived on said land for several years when Amos Moore died, without ever having married and without leaving a will, leaving as his ole heirs at law, his mother, Mrs. Carrie Moore and the above named brothers and sister and above named nephew and niece.

Coly Moore and Arthur Moore continued to live there with their mother, Mrs. Carrie Moore until Coly Moore married. Arthur Moore and his mother continued to live on above described land for severl years.

About the year, 1924, all the other heirs of my father conveyed their interest in above described land to Coly Moore and placed him in exclusive possession.

The said Coly Moore rented said land to tenants who lived upon it and cultivated it and paid rent to him and none of the heirs of R.B. Moore made any further claim to said property.

About the year, 1936, Coly Moore and wife Lillian Moore conveyed to A.B. Rasco and wife Dollie Rasco the South half of the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Section 33, Township 19, Range 1 East.

Mr. and Mrs. Rasco moved on said place and lived there several years when Mr. Rasco died. Mrs. Rasco has continued to live on said land claiming to own the same until a very short time ago when she moved to Birmingham, except that I am told Mrs. Rasco deeded off one and one half acres in the Northeast corner East of the road to her daughter and her husband who have built a home there.

As to the South half of the Southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Section 33, Township

19, Range 1 East, except one and one-half acres described as beginning at the Northeast corner of said South
half of Southwest quarter of southwest quarter and run west 217 feet, more or less to Sterrett Road and South
along said road, 366 feet; thence East 108 feet, more or less to the East line of said southwest quarter of
southwest quarter; thence North 366 feet, to point of beginning. Since I can remember, my grandfather, H.G.
Moore, my father, R.B. Moore, my step-mother, Mrs. Carrie Moore, my brother, Coly Moore, A.B. Rasco and his
widow, Mrs. Dollie Rasco have been in the continuous, actual, exclusive, peaceful, quite, open, notorious,
adverse hostitle, possession of said property under color of title and claim of ownership and I have never
known of any person being in possession of any part of said land, claiming to hold adverse to them, neither
have I known of their title being questioned.
