Before me theundersigned authority in and for said County in said State, personally appeared Vonzelle Mooney Shrader, who, being first duly sworn on oath says that she is a daughter of J.L. Mooney, deceased, who died intestate on January 28, 1948, and whose estate was Administered in the Probate Court of Shelby County, Alabama.

Affiant further says that the heirs at law, ten in number, set out in the Administration Proceedings are correct, except that the name of affiant is spelled Vonzelle, and not Vonzella.

Affiant further says that her father purchased from C.L. Mooney, Grandfather of affiant a ten acre tract lying on the West side of the Southeast Quarter of the South East Quarter of Section 26, Township 20, Range 2 West, on which affiant's father constructed a residence in which affiant and her brothers and sisters were both and reared and that her said father also purchased from her Grand-father 50 acres, more or less; lying about a quarter of a mile West of a 10 acre tract and which is situated in the South one-half of the South West Quarter of said Section 26. Affiant further says that she knows the ridge mentioned in descriptions of this property and that said ridge runs in an Easterly and Westerly direction about 2/3 of the way North of the South line of said two 10 acre tracts and affiant further says that there is also a mountain which lies approximately along the South line of said two forties and which mountain is called Locust Ridge or was so called when affiant was a girl.

Affiant further sayd that her father during his lifetime cultivated and had under fence this fifty acre tract which lies North of Lucust Ridge and South of another fidge lying approximately eight hundred or nine hundred feet North of Locust Ridge and this second ridge was known as the dividing line between the property of J.L. Mooney and the property lying North of his property.

Affiant further says that she knows the forty acre tract bought by her father from J.W. Stone and that this forty acre tract lay between the residence of J.L. Mooney and the fifty acre tract bought from the grand-father of affiant, that is the forty acre tract was between the 10 acre tract and the 50 acre tract.

Affiant further says that her father cultivated all of the property herein described or a substantial portion thereof for more than twenty years to the recollection of affiant and had the same under fence and that the boundaries were well defined and that no one ever disputed the title of her father to any part of the property during the period of almost fifty years that he owned the same nor has anyone disputed the title to the heirs at law of J.L. Mooney since his death.
