Before the undersigned authority personally appeared Mrs. Leila Adams Carden who is known to me and who being by me first duly sworn does depose and say:

I am one and the same person as Leila Adams, who with Martha J. Ray, Amos Adams and Florence Walton deeded certain land situated in Shelby County to B.B. McCullers on October 15, 1904, record of which appears in deed book 50 at page 381 in the Office of the Judge of Probate Shelby County, Alabama. The said Martha J. Ray was my mother and she was the widow of John A. Adams, my father, who obtained title to the land described in the aforementioned deed from H.C.C. Blackerby and wife, Lena E. Blackerby on January 23, 1875, which deed appears in deed book 61 at page 109 in the Office of the Judge of Probate, Shelby County, Alabama. Following the death of John A. Adams in 1884 my mother, Martha J. Adams married J.R. Ray.

Martha J. Ray, Amos Adams, Leila Adams and Florence Walton, the grantors mentioned in the deed first above referred to, constituted the sole heirs at law and next of kin of John A. Adams at the time the first above mentioned deed was executed. Neither the undersigned nor Amos Adams, who was my brother were married at the time said deedwas executed. My mother was married to J.R. Ray at that time. My mother died in 1917and J.R. Ray has been dead for about ten years.

Florence Walton, my sister, was married to James H. Walton at that time. James H. Walton joined in the execution of a warranty deed together with the above mentioned heirs of John A. Adams, which conveyed the same property, on October 12, 1910, record of which appears in deed book 43 at page 520 in the Office of the Judge of Probate, Shelby County, Alabama.
