TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

WHEREAS, James Mahan of Bibb County has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said James Mahan according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 2hth of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands", for The East half of the Southwest Quarter of Section Eighteen, in Township twenty four of Range twelve East, in the District of Lands offered for sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, containing eighty acres and twenty onehundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said James Mahan.

NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have "iven and Granted, and by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said James Mahan, & to his heirs, the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereto belonging, unto the said James Mahan, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, John Quincy Adams, President of the United States of America, have caused these letterst to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
