Perry, who is the daughter of George Weaver, and wife, Altha V. Weaver, sometimes known as Mrs. A. V. Weaver, neing the one and same person as Altha V. Weaver; that your affiant and the said Frances W. Weaver were married in Shelby "ounty, Alabama, on or about the 30 day of Nov., 1899, and have lived in the vicinity of the above described lands until this date.

Affiant further says that George Weaver died intestate in Shelby County, Alabama, on the 24 day of August, 1900, and left surviving him his widow, Altha . Weaver, and three children, namely: J. E. Weaver, Frances W. Perry, being the same person as F. W. Perry, and J. A. Weaver, as the sole survivors and the sole next of kin of the said George Weaver, deceased; affiant further says that on November 9, 1904, the heirs at law and next of kin of George Weaver, deceased, were Altha V.
