McGuire has been dead approximately fifteen years and probably longer, and said S. A.D. McGuire has been dead for ten years or more.

I was also acquainted with Thomas B. Miller and Wife, Annie P. Miller, who are grantors in that certain deed dated March 20, 1895, in which Jessie Miller was grantee and which deed Book is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in Deed Book 24, at page 232. Mr. Thomas B. Miller has been dead over forty years and his wife has been dead twenty or twenty-five years.

I was acquainted with Frank Miller and wife Mamie L. Miller, who are the grantors in that certain deed dated March 2, 1900, and recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama in Deed book 25, at page 280, and in which Jessie B. Barber is the grantee. Frank Miller is dead and he was divorced from Mamie L. Miller, but she too is now dead.
