Whereas *Earl and David of Shelby County*

has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa in Alabama

whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said *Earl and David*

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the East half of the North East quarter of Section 11, Township 10 North, Range 10 East, in the District of Alabama and State of Alabama, containing Eighty Acres and Twenty-nine and a half hundredths of an acre

according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said *Earl and David*

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said *Earl and David* and *his heirs* the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said *Earl and David* and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.
