WHEREAS, James F. McAdams of Shelby County, Alabama, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United Sttes. a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tuscaloosa, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said James F. AcAdams according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provisions for the sale of the Public Lands," for the North half of the North East quarter of Section Thirty four, the South East quarter; and the Southeast quarter of the North east quarter of section Twenty seven, in Township Twenty One of Tange one East in the district of lands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama containing two hundred and seventy two acres and ninety hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the Survey of said lands, returned to the General and office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said James F. Cadams.

NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in formformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN, AND CRANTED, and by these presents do GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said James F. MmAdams, and to his heirs, the said tract above described. To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said James F. mcAdams, and to his heirs and assigns forever.
