Kincer according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the North half of the North East quarter and the South West quarter of the North East quarter of section six, in township number four, Range two East of Huntsville description, in Alabama, containing one thousand and twenty acres and twenty-five hundredths of an acre;

according to the Official Plan of the Survey of the said lands, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said Tract has been purchased by the said

Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, Have given and granted, and by these presents Do give and grant, unto the said James H. Kincer and to his heirs, the said Tract above described; To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said James H. Kincer and to his heirs and assigns forever.

have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
