To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

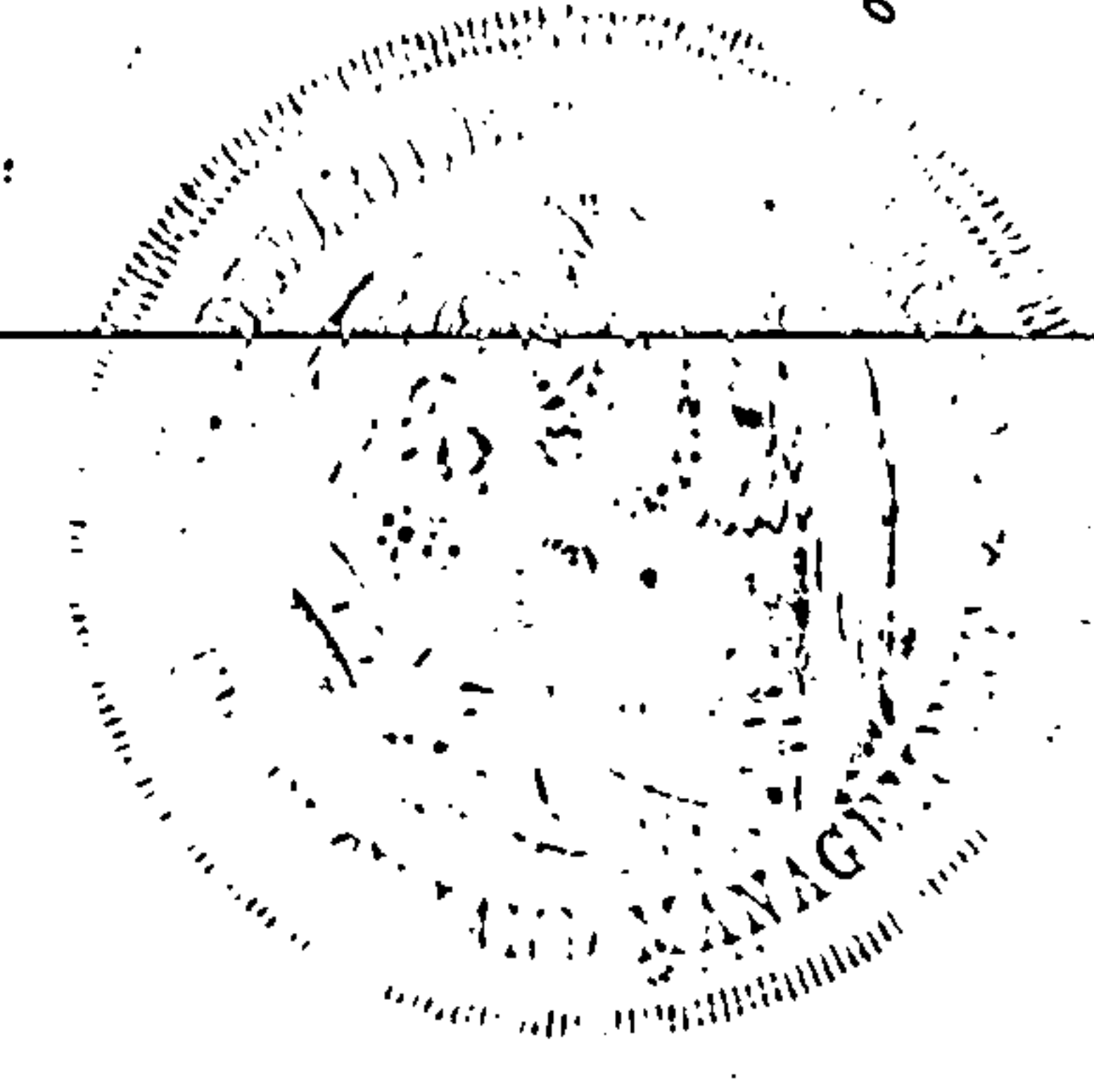

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Isaac Heavith, and to his heirs, the said tract above described; To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said Isaac Heavith
