all the right, title and interest of the said Secretary of the Land Office, and his heirs and assigns forever, in and to the said lands, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatever nature thereto belonging, unto the said Secretary of the Land Office, and his heirs and assigns forever.
