Before the undersigned authority personally appeared Mary
Adelaide Knowles, who is known to me and who being by me first duly sworn
deposes and says:

I am acquainted with the East half of the Northeast Quarter of
Section 14, Township 22, Range 3 West, Shelby County, Alabama, and have known
this land as far back as I can recollect. In the deed of Joseph Milton Allen
and Lenora Alice Allen, dated August 2, 1935, and recorded in the Probate
Office of Shelby County, Alabama, in Deed Book 96, at page 207, along with
other land there was conveyed to me ten acres situated in the said East half
of Northeast Quarter described as follows:

Ten acres in the East half of the Northeast Quarter,
Section 14, Township 22, Range 3 West, Shelby County,
Alabama, which is bounded as follows: on the West by
the North and South lines of said East half of Northeast
Quarter, Section 14; on the North by Spring Creek, on the
East by Spring Creek church lot, and continuing South
far enough to contain ten acres.

I was born on this ten acres. Joseph Milton Allen, my father, resided on this
ten acre tract of land. The balance of this eighty acres of land is owned by
Henry Tola Allen, except the church lot and graveyard. The two of us together,
therefore, own the entire East half of the Northeast Quarter of said Section
14, and I have been in possession of the ten acres, living upon it and
cultivating portions of it each and every year since I obtained the deed from
Joseph Milton Allen and wife and during that time I have had the actual, open,
notorious, exclusive, adverse, hostile possession of the ten acres and there
are no conflicts between my holdings and said Henry Tola Allen.
