I am a son of E.G. Givhan and Lena Givhan both deceased. I am familiar with the property conveyed by my father and mother to Wilbur Denson by deed of June 1, 1922, which is recorded in the Office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama, in Deed Book 69 at page 529. Said property being described as follows:

Lot Number Eleven (11), Storr's and Troy Addition to the Town of Montevallo, Alabama, according to survey and map of said Storr's and Troy Addition, as recorded in the Office of the Probate Judge of Shelby County, situated in Shelby County, Alabama.

I also know the said Wilbur Denson and I know that his true name was Wilbur King. His mother had been a Denson by a former marriage and the mistake was made in the deed as naming him Wilbur Denson when it should have been Wilbur King and I know that the said Wilbur King and the said Wilbur Denson, grantee in said deed was one and the same person and that the said Wilbur King went into possession of above described property under said deed and remained in possession until the time of his death on November 15, 1951.

I was well acquainted with the said Wilbur King during his life time and knew his family well. I know that the said Wilbur King was never married, that his father and mother are both dead, that he left no brothers surviving him nor the decedents of brothers and that he had only one sister. Her name is Mittie Mae King, who is his sole heir at law.
