I am a resident of Tallabase County, Alabama and am 73 years of ago. I am the affiant in that certain affidavit dated November 5, 1951 and recorded in Volume 149 Page 264, in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama; that, supplementing aforesaid affidavit, the affiant states that the grantees in the deed from Susan M. McKenzje to Ella Ware, Mary S. Ware, Julia E. (6.2m. ward) Ware and Elisha M. X. Ware and Margaret Ware, dated May 2, 1895 and recorded in Volume 25, Page 201 in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, are the affiant, and affiant's mother and three sisters; that, on the date of said deed, the affiant's father, Elisha Russell Ware, was dead, and that the deed described above was made for the purpose of placing the whole undivided title to the South 1/2 of NET of Sec. 12 Tp. 24, R 15 East, Shelby County Alabama, in the grantees therein; that the grantees took possession of said property immediately and, subsequent to the death of affiant's mother, Ella McKenzie Ware, affiant and affiant's two sisters conveyed their respective interests to K. N. Matthews and Wife, Mamie Ware Matthews, in the manner and on the date set out in affiant's affidavit of November 5, 1951; that K. N. Matthews and wife, Mamie Ware Matthews, immediately took possession of said land, holding it open and adverse to all the world, including the previous joint owners thereof, as their own property; that, after K.
