Certificate.

WHEREAS there are no grants or entries of land in the state of Maine  
had deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Washington, in the name  
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Richard Smeazam  
according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for  
the Surveyor General to accept and pay over to the State of Maine, the sum of one hundred thousand dollars, to be used for the  
purposes contained in the said act, and for the payment of expenses  
incurred in the execution of the same; and  
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-  
chased by the said Richard Smeazam.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several  
acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted, and, by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Richard Smeazam  
the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appur-  
tenances, of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Richard Smeazam  
and  
his heirs and assigns forever.

PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA; have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be affixed.
