To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Willis Pecking, of the City of New York, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Newark, certifying it appears that full payment has been made by the said Willis Pecking, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 2d of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the tract of land described as follows, to-wit: "A tract of land in the District of New Jersey, subject to State and Federal taxes, or otherwise, containing Thirty Nine acres and twenty three and a half thousandths, according to the official plan of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said tract has been purchased by the said Willis Pecking,

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Willis Pecking, and to his heirs the said tract above described, and to his heirs the said tract above described.

It has and so hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatever nature therunto belonging unto the said Willis Pecking, and to his heirs and assigns forever.
