To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting.

Whereas William Hughes of the County of Henry, State of Virginia, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Washington, D.C. in which it appears that full payment has been made by the said William Hughes according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 22d of April 1820 entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the West half of Section 12, Township 12 North, Range 10 East, in the District of Columbia, and State of Virginia, containing seventy eight acres and eighty two hundredths of an acre.

According to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said William Hughes.
Now Know Ye that the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in recognition of the Services and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said William Hughes and his heirs and assigns forever the said tract above described. To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said William Hughes and his heirs and assigns forever.
