I am the daughter of E. S. Lyman, Sr., and F. May Lyman. I was born and reared in the Town of Montevallo, Alabama, and lived here all my life except a few occasions during my marriage when I made my home temporarily elsewhere. During the time that I did not have my home in Montevallo, I visited my family and relatives there frequently. I am familiar with the land described as follows:

Commence at the NE Corner, Section 29, Township 22 S. Range 3 W, and run South 0 degrees 30 minutes E along E. line of said section a distance of 253.31 ft. to the south bank of Shoal Creek to the point of beginning; thence N 82 degrees 14 W along south bank of said creek a distance of 333.70 ft.; thence S 15 degrees 54' W a distance of 506.00 ft. to the south line of Sec. 29; thence N 89 degrees 30' E along south line of said section a distance of 464.00 ft to the south east corner of said Sec 29; thence continue N 89 degrees 30' E along the south line of Sec. 28 a distance of 170.00 ft.; thence N 1 degree 09' W a distance of 124.36 ft.; thence N 25 degrees 21' E a distance of 125.95 ft.; thence N 87 degrees 38 ' E. a distance of 106.10 ft.; thence N 3 degrees 39' E a distance of 132,60 ft. to the south bank of Shoal Creek; thence N 81 degrees 25' W along south bank of said creek 202.50 ft.; thence N 74 degrees 08' W a dist. of 145.90 ft. to the point of beginning. Situated in Sections 28 and 29, Township 22S, Range 3 W, Shelby County, Alabama.

My father and subsequently his heirs have owned and have had adverse and notorious possession of this property for more than twenty (20) years. And that during this time the possession has been undisturbed and peaceful.

Along about the time of the early thirties I remember my father pastured some horses and cattle on this land and I remember that the cows were driven to and from the cow barn at home every day. My father died about the year, 1935. At his death my mother had the actual possession of the property and she rented it to Mr. Walter Fancher until the time of her death in 1943. Since the time of my mother's death, I have looked after the property for myself and the other heirs and have rented it to Mr. Walter Fancher for

pasture up to the first of the year, 1952. The other heirs and myself have been planning to sell this property. For this reason I did not rent the property to Mr. Fancher for the year of 1952, but have given him permission to pasture his cows there temporarily.
