That the said Pearl Walker obtained a deed on November 3, 1916 from I. E. Rayborn to an undivided one—third interest, to-wit:

That on November 15, 1916 she received a deed from D. C. Nickerson to the $NW_{4}^{\frac{1}{4}}$ of the $NE_{4}^{\frac{1}{4}}$ of said section, township and range and a portion of the $NE_{4}^{\frac{1}{4}}$ of the $NE_{4}^{\frac{1}{4}}$ of said section, township and range.

That immediately after receiving said deeds the said Pearl Walker and affiant took actual possession of all of the following described lands to-wit:

 $NW_{4}^{\frac{1}{4}}$ of $NE_{4}^{\frac{1}{4}}$ and 10 acres off the East side of the $NE_{4}^{\frac{1}{4}}$ of $NW_{4}^{\frac{1}{4}}$, all in Section 15, Township 21, Range 3 West, Shelby County, Alabama, known as the Sophia A. Foust lands.

That immediately following said purchase the said Pearl Walker and I moved on said lands and lived there for several months. After moving from said lands next above described we had the same cultivated and rented the same to various tenants down to the 10th day of November, 1927, at which time said lands were sold to L. J. Smith by deed recorded in Volume 79 at Page 586, Record of Deeds, Shelby County, Alabama. That said deed was corrected by that certain deed recorded in Volume 83 at Page 422, Record of Deeds in said Probate office. That upon a sale of said lands to the said L. J. Smith He immediately took possession thereof.

That from 1916 to the 10th day of November, 1927 affiant and the said Pearl Walker had actual, open, continuous, notorious, hostile, peaceable, adverse possession of said lands for more than

said property for taxes and paid the taxes thereon. That our said possession was evidenced by our living on said land, cultivating the same and renting said land to tenants for cultivation. That we exercised all of the usual incidence of ownership of the same. That no one else ever asserted any right, claim or interest in said land during the time that we owned and had possession of same.
