Dunning, heirs, the said Tract above-described; To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, therunto belonging, unto the said John M. Dunning, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States of America,

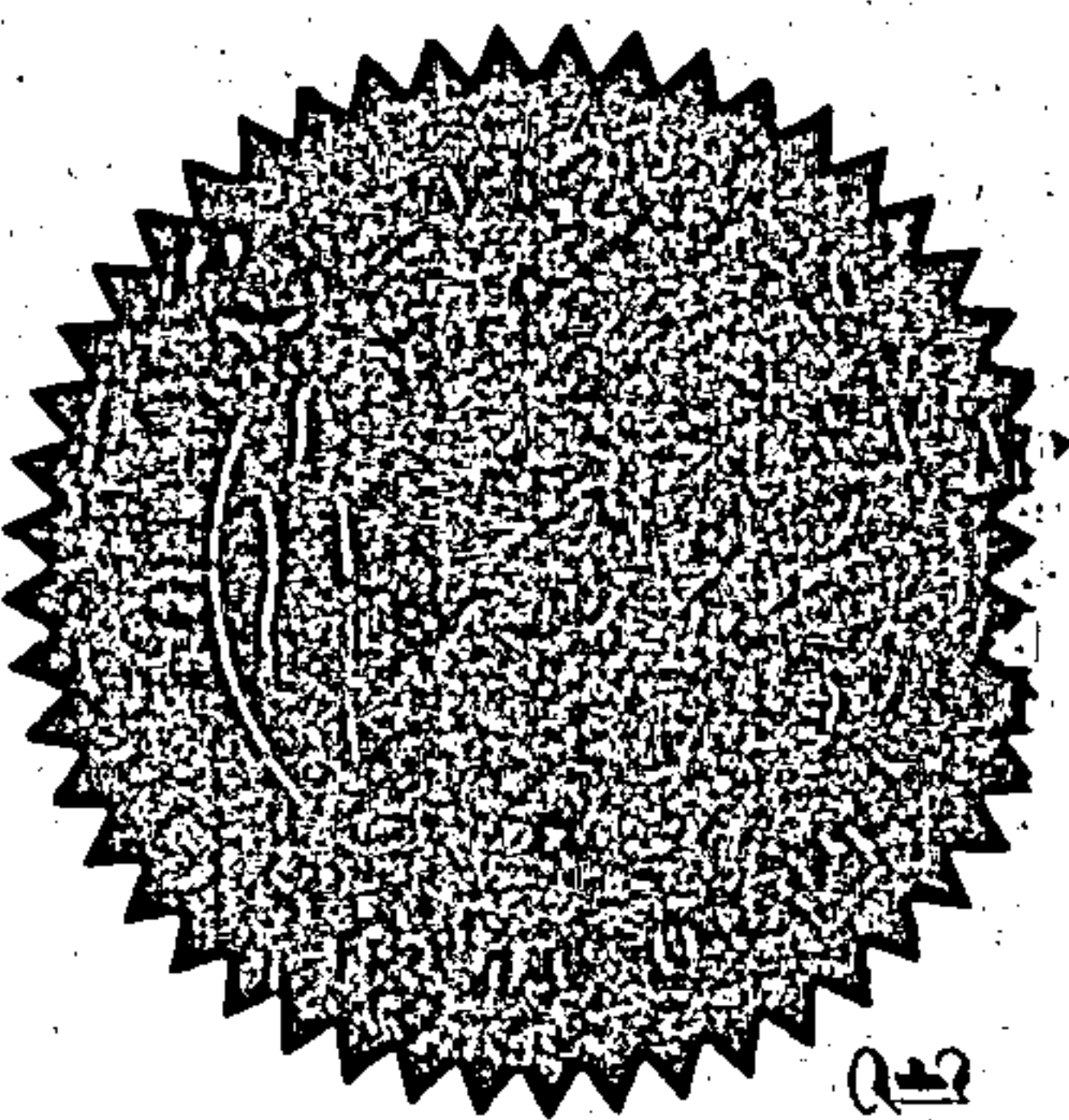
have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
