Whereas, in pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved SEPTEMBER 28TH, 1850, ENTITLED "AN ACT GRANTING BOUNTY LAND TO CERTAIN OFFICERS AND SOLDIERS WHO HAVE BEEN ENGAGED IN THE MILITARY SERVICE OF THE UNITED STATES," Warrent No. 6951 for 160 acres, issued in favor of Andrew J. Ellis and George J. Ellis of the Seventh Regiment of Volunteers of the State of New York;

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the West half of the North West quarter and the West half of the North East quarter of Section 10, in Township 2 North of Range 11 East, in the District of Columbia containing one hundred and fifty and fifty hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office, by the SURVEYOR GENERAL,

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Andrew J. Ellis

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Andrew J. Ellis and his heirs and assigns forever.
