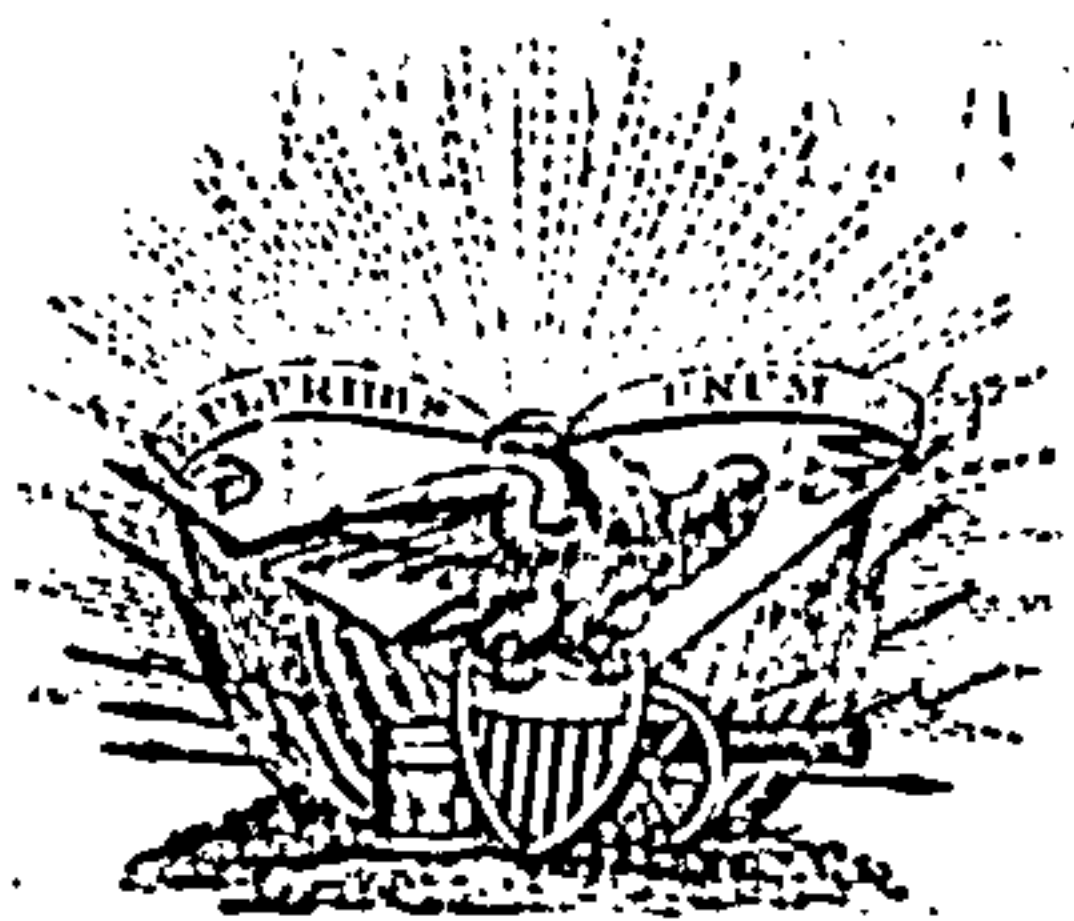




THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 29881 for 80 acres, issued in favor of *Richard Woodruff Private Captains Phillips and Little Companies Georgia Militia War 1812.*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *North half of the North west quarter of fractional Section Six, in Township twenty four of range Indian east. In the District of lands Subject to Sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama Containing eighty acres.*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *Which has been assigned to John Wesley.*

Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *John Wesley.*

the Tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *John Wesley and to his.*

heirs and assigns forever.
