Whereas there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a CERTIFICATE of the Register of the Land Office at Montgomery, Alabama, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of James Davis has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the west half of the south east quarter, and the west half of the north east quarter of section four in township twenty-one south of range one west of Hunterville Meridian in Alabama, containing one hundred and sixty acres and three hundredth of an acre

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL.

Now know ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said James Davis the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said James Davis and to his heirs and assigns forever.

President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
