To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, Thomas Gargile, of Shelby county,

has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Washington,

whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Thomas Gargile,

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the land - West fraction of Section twenty-two, in Township twenty-two, of Range one, East, in the district of lands offered for sale at Washington, D.C., containing one hundred and twenty-five acres, and twenty-eight hundredths of an acre,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Thomas Gargile.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Thomas Gargile, and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatever nature thereto belonging, unto the said Thomas Gargile, heirs and assigns forever.

PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
