To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas the State of Guatemal

has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Washington, D.C.

whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said State of Guatemal

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for

the first half of the fourth quarter of certain Mexican territory, situated in the State of Guatemal, containing eighty acres, more or less, as shown

in the Certificate of the Surveyor General, and in conformity with the several

acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said State of Guatemal

the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appur

tenances, of whatever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said State of Guatemal

and his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto

affixed.
