To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Know all men, Littleberry County, of Holly county,

that deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Tahlequah,

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" for the West half of the fourth west quarter of Section two, in Township twenty-four, of Range fifteen East, in the District of Lands offered for sale at Tahlequah, Oklahoma, containing seventy-one acres, and twenty-eight hundredths of an acre,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Littleberry County.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Littleberry County, and to its heirs and assigns forever, the said tract above described; To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereto belonging, unto the said Littleberry County, and to its heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, John Quincy Adams, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Written, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the city of Washington, the first day of December in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, and of the Independence of the United States the first.
