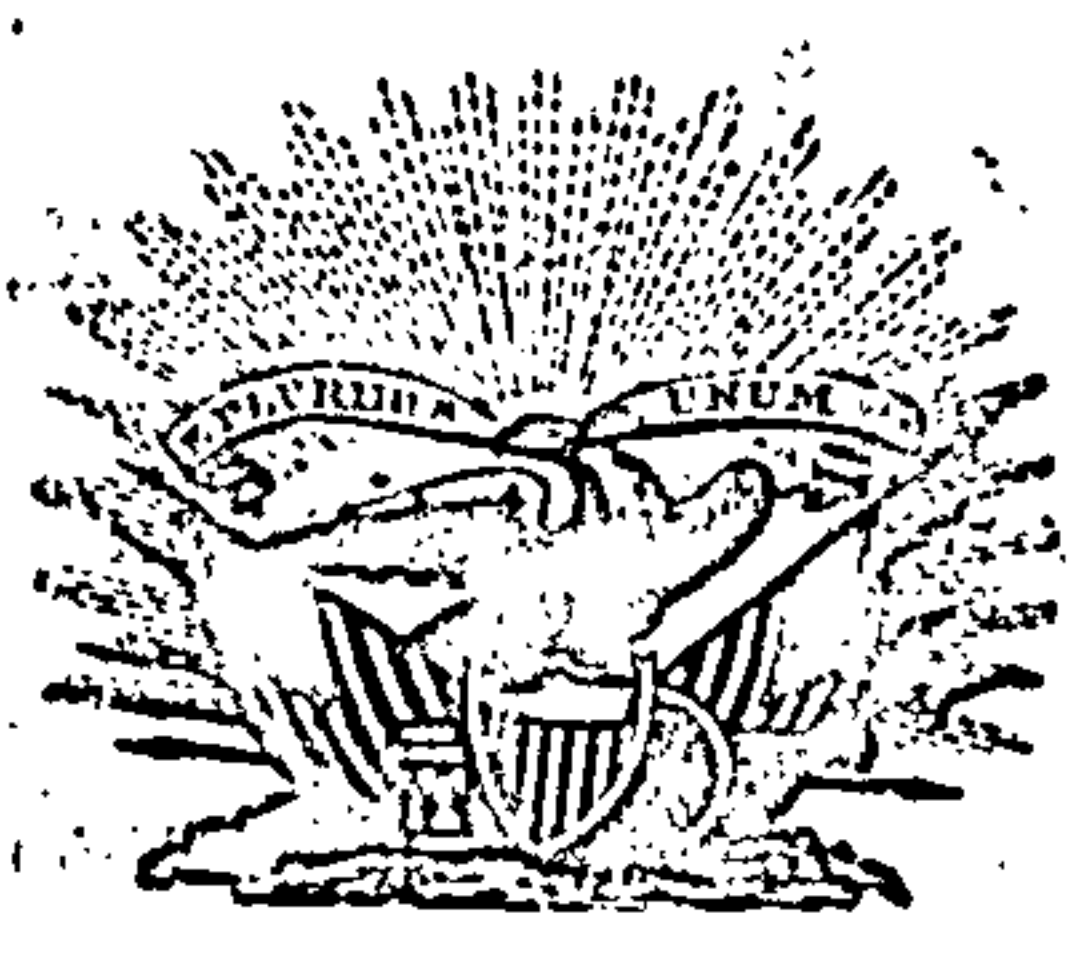

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 34118 for 80 acres, issued in favor of James Hinton Private in Captain James Company Georgia Volunteers War 1812

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the South East quarter of the North East quarter and the North East quarter of the South East quarter of Section Twenty two in Township twenty one of Range one West in the District of Sands subject to sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama containing Seventy nine acres, and seventy seven hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: Which has been assigned to Henry W. Collier

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Henry W. Collier and to his
