To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Samuel Chapman, of the County of Hamilton, State of New York, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at New York, in relation to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 3rd of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the tract of the North East quarter of the section 36, of Township 4 North, Range 10 West, in the 1st Township of Hamilton County, New York, and that the said Samuel Chapman, in pursuance of the provisions of the said act, has caused the said tract to be surveyed and returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been surveyed by the said Surveyor General.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Samuel Chapman, his heirs and assigns forever, the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Samuel Chapman, his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, J. Samuel Chapman, President of the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made, Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the 10th day of June, 1953, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty three, and of the Independence of the United States the forty-eighth.
