he resides at Calera, in Shelby County, Alabama, and that he has so
resided for a period of more than sixty years, last past; that for
a period of fifty years, or more, last past, he has been acquainted
with the location, use, ownership, and parties in possession of the
following described lands, to wit:

Commencing at a point on the North side of
Tenth Avenue (10th) 90 feet West from the
Northwest corner of Tenth Street and Thir-
teenth Avenue, thence West 75 feet, thence
North 100 feet, thence East 75 feet, thence
