Personally came and appeared before me, S.A. Lokey, a notary public in and for the State of Alabama at Large, R.J. Mabry, who, after being first by me duly sworn according to law to speak the truth deposes and says:

That he is well acquainted with the hereinafter described land, having lived on adjacent land since the year 1937, said lands being described as follows, to-wit:

That part of the Southeast Quarter of Northeast Quarter of Section 33, Township 21 South, Range 2 West, which lies East of affiant's land; all that part of the West half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 34, lying North of the Columbiana-Dargin Public Road; the West half of Northwest Quarter of Section 34 and the West half of Southwest Quarter of Section 27, all in Township 21 South, Range 2 West.

When he first became acquainted with this property, one Ben Scoggins was living on said land and cultivated part of it as a tenant of Twin Oak Land Company. He continued as a tenant for about one year, when he moved from said land. Since then various tenants from time to time have cultivated small portions of said land and one tenant, whose name he does not remember, lived on said land for several years. All of these tenants were tenants of the said Twin Oak Land Company up to 1942, when Twin Oak Land Company conveyed said lands to J.O. Anderson and Willie L. Chambliss. All tenants since that time have been tenants of the said J.O. Anderson and Willie L. Chambliss.

No one else has at any time been in possession of any part of said lands claiming adverse to the said J.O. Anderson and Willie L. Chambliss and their predecessors in title, the Twin Oak Land Company nor has affiant ever known of anyone claiming any right, title or interest in or to said lands adverse to said owners.

Affiant knows that no one by the name of J.W. Harden or J.I. Harden has at any time within the past ten years been in possession of any part of above described land or made any claim thereto.

The possession of the said J.O. Anderson and Willie L. Chambliss and their predecessors in title, the Twin Oak Land Company have been since 1937, open, notorious, peaceful, quiet, actual, direct, ^{adverse} hostile, under color of title and claim of ownership.
