That he was the son of C. T. Davidson the grantee in that certain Warranty Deed recorded in Deed Book 43, Page 581, in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama.

Affiant further states that his father upon acquiring this property from the Driscoll Estate in January 1911, immediately took possession of the property through a tenant by name of J. W. Harris who rented the property for a period of three years cultivating same, keeping up the fences and exercising all rights as lessee of C. T. Davidson. Affiant states his father continued in possession by renting to various people and held the property openly, notoriously, adversely and exercised every right of ownership up until his death in 1926.

Affiant states his father's heirs then continued in possession of the property through tenants until the property was conveyed on the 18th day of November 1931 to Harry H. Knowles as per deed recorded in Deed Book 89, Page 438, in the Office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Ala.

Affiant further states that his father C. T. Davidson died intestate during year of 1926 survived by the following heirs; Mrs. L. B. Davidson, his widow; Mrs. Ada Lowery, a widow; J. W. Davidson whose wife is Mrs. Frankie B. Davidson; R. B. Davidson whose wife is Mamie Ruth Davidson, Mrs. Nell V. Mullins whose husband was L. C. Mullins, ^{and} J. S. Davidson whose wife is Mrs. J. S. Davidson who were all over the age of twenty-one years on November 18, 1931 and he was not survived by any child of a deceased child.
