Before the undersigned authority, personally appeared Adam Wyatt, who is known to me, and who being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says:

W. W. Wyatt was my father. He is now dead. On April 24, 1929 he executed a mineral lease to George A. Raguse, to run for a period of 5 years, with right of renewal. There has never been any renewal of the lease. All the prospecting or other work that Raguse did under the lease was to do a little prospecting and that took place within a year from the time the lease was executed and he has not operated there since.

On the 18th day of June, 1931 my father executed a lease to V. O. Smith for mineral rights, and this lease is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama in Deed Book 92 at page 404. Only a small amount of work was done under this lease. Only a hole or two was drilled and no renewal of the lease was ever executed, and there has been no work done under the lease for the last twenty years.

My father executed to Clifford K. Rubin a lease, on August 5, 1937, which lease is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama in Deed Record 103 at page 265. Practically no work was done under this contract or lease. There has never been a renewal of the lease, and there has been no operation carried on under the lease in the last fifteen years either by Rubin or any one else.

The abstract shows that on August 25, 1930 Judson L. Burke assigned to U. G. Hutchinson a mineral lease purporting to be executed by W. W. Wyatt and Mrs. C. A. Wyatt, who was my mother. This lease is not of record, but I do know that there has been no operation under the lease for the last twenty years.
