Before me, John Foshee, a Notary Public for said County and said State personally appeared Henry H. Little who after being duly sworn deposes and says as follows: I have been familiar with the ownership and possession, for the past 50 years or so, of property described as follows:

A tract of land located in $S\frac{1}{2}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 9, Township 24, Range 12 East described as: Commence at the half-mile point on Section line running between Sections 8 and 9 and run North 87 deg 45' East which is along the median line running East and West through said Section 9, for a distance of 826.1 feet to point of beginning; thence run along NE side of Hubbard lot, North 54 deg 55' West 441.5 feet; thence North 50 deg 40' West 146 feet to Eastern margin of Montevallo and Wilton Highway; thence North 36 deg 54' East along the said Highway margin 232.9 feet; thence run North 89 deg 15' East 1495.2 feet to a point; thence South 1 deg East 497.1 feet to point on South line of $SE\frac{1}{4}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$; thence along South line of $S\frac{1}{2}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$, South 87 deg 45' West 1170 feet to point of beginning. Situated in Shelby County, Alabama

I am 74 years of age and have lived in Wilton for about 60 years. J. W. Little was my brother and I remember when he bought the above described property from the Hoopers of Selma, Alabama in about the year of 1903. My brother J. W. Little and J. Wesley Little, who conveyed this property to William S. Thompson in about the year 1908 are one and the same person. J. W. Little lived on the place and rented some of the land out, for farming purposes, during the time he owned it.

William S. Thompson who purchased the property in about the 1908 and W. S. Thompson are one and the same person. William S. Thompson lived on the property until his death. Since his death some of his heirs lived on the property until they conveyed it to Mrs. D. R. Linholm in about the year 1944.

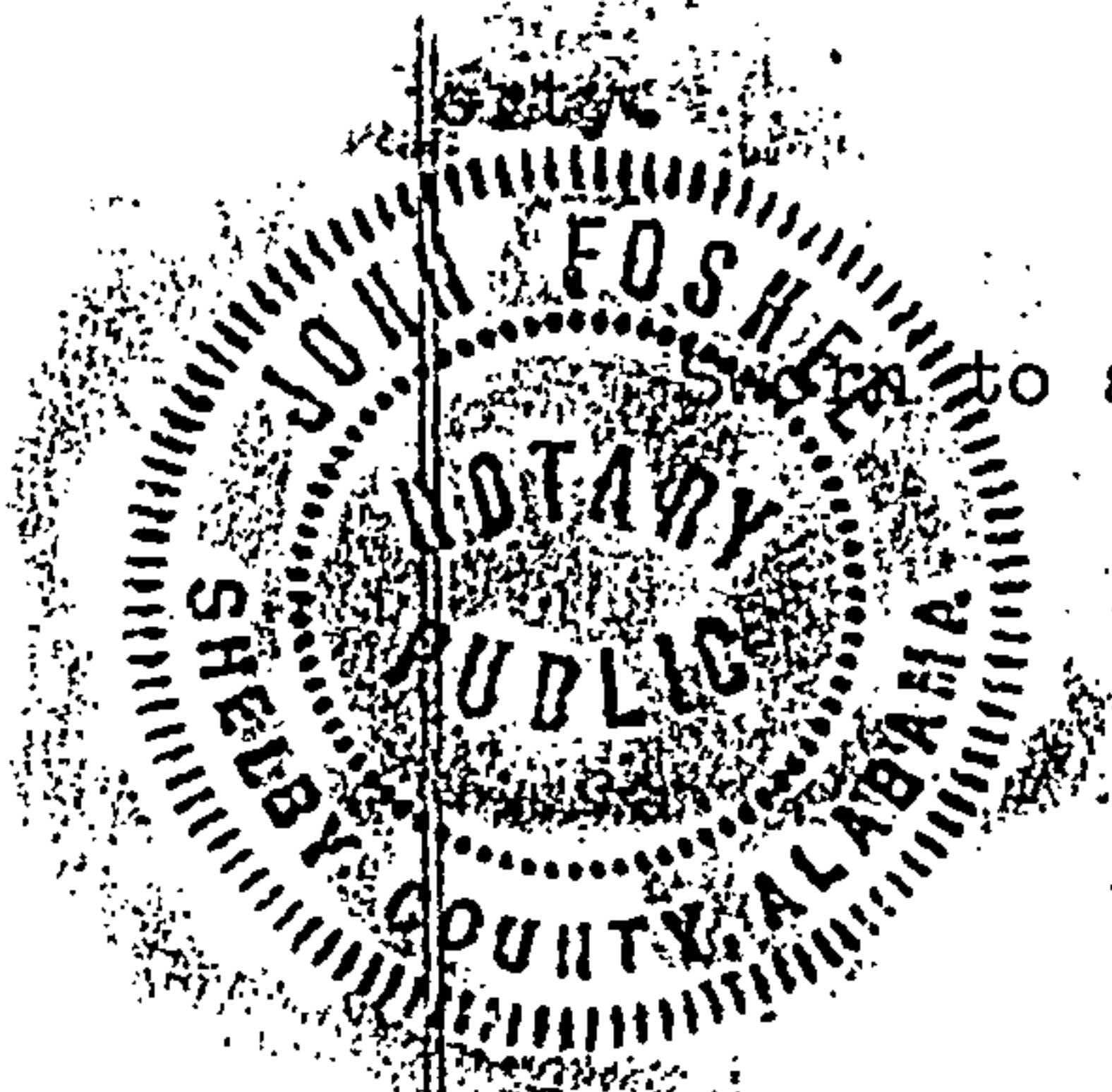
