Before me, Eugene Daughtry, the undersigned authority in and for said county in said state personally appeared J. M. GRAYSON who after being by me first duly sworn to speak the truth, deposes and says:

My name is J. M. GRAYSON. I am VICE - GRAYSON of the Grayson Lumber Company and as such officer have knowledge that Mary F. Tipton and husband, John W. Tipton, executed a Timber Deed to Grayson Lumber Company on February 26, 1944, which conveyed certain timber on certain in Shelby County, Alabama, the same being shown in said deed which is recorded in Deed Book 118 Page 154 in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama. Said officer further says that under said deed Grayson Lumber Company was granted a period of 2½ years from February 26, 1944, in which to cut and remove said timber and that no extension of time was granted in connection with said deed for the removal of said timber and that at the end of 2½ years, all rights which Grayson Lumber Company had in said land and timber seized to exist and all timber on the land at that time reverted to the makers of said deed.
