I am one of the grantors in that certain deed dated December 31, 1932, recorded in deed book 95 at page 168 in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama, conveying the following described property to Charles J. Perry:

The NE_{4}^{1} of NW_{4}^{1} of Section 25, Township 19, Range 3 West, situated in Shelby County, Alabama. Minerals and mining right excepted.

Said conveyance was intended to deed the interest of all of the heirs of Frank Y. Anderson, deceased, my father, who died on about July 1911, his last will and testament was filed for record on July 8, 1911 in Record of Wills Vol. M, Page 235, office of the Judge of Probate of Jefferson County, Alabama. All the bequests in that will have been carried out. Said will provided that among other things as follows:

"I give the residue of my real and personal property and choses in action to my wife, Lucy W. Anderson, for and during her natural life, to be used in such manner as she may deem proper for the benefit of herself and my children, with authority to make such advancements to adult children as she may deem proper, and not in excess of the share which such adult child is expected to be entitled to on final distribution, to be accounted for on final distribution, and after her death such as remains undisposed of by her shall be divided equally amont the children of mine living at my death, and as such issue of any child or children of mine then deceased as shall survive me, and his, her or their heirs, respectively, in equal shares, as between brothers and sisters, and so that the child or the children collectively of any deceased child or grand children shall take only the share which his, her, or their parent would have taken if living."

The next of kin of my deceased father as set out in the minutes of Probate of said will were as follows: Lucy W. Anderson, widow; Frank Yarborough Anderson, over 21; Pelham Hansard Anderson, over 21; Winston Paine Anderson, under 21 and over 14; Kate Leedy Anderson, under 21 and over 14; Benjamin Paine Anderson, under 14; Lucy Winston Anderson under 14 and the affiant.

Lucy W. Anderson, the widow of Frank Y. Anderson, departed this life in November, 1931 . Of the grantors in the aforementioned deed Pelham H. Anderson is one and the same person as Pelham Hansard Anderson. C. F. Anderson is one and the same person as Charles Frederick Anderson. Benjamin Anderson is one and the same person as Benjamin Paine Anderson. Lucy A. Gow is one and the same person as Lucy Winston Anderson. Kate L. Anderson is one and the same person as Kate Leedy Anderson and Kathleen V. H. Anderson is the widow of Frank Y. Anderson, Jr., deceased. Winston Paine Anderson died in France on or about July 4, 1918, He was unmarried and left no issue. Said Kate L. Anderson was non compos mentis, no legal guardian was appointed by the court and she died intestate, unmarried and without issue on or about fourteen years ago. My grandmother, Maria L. Paine, and my aunt, Nannie H. Anderson, to whom my father made personal bequests in his will, have been dead many years Frank Y. Anderson, Jr. died intestate, August 1932. He left surviving him Kattrieen V. H. Anderson and three children, Frank Y. Anderson, 111 whose wife is Blanche Anderson; Virginia Anderson, an unmarried woman∕and James Winston Anderson, an unmarried man, now all over the age of 21.
