I am acquainted with the following described land in Shelby County, Alabama:

I have known this land all of my life, and I am 74 years of age. My husband was J. A. Bird, who died in 1934. Fore more than 10 years prior to his death he was in actual, open, notorious, continous, exclusive, hostile and adverse possession of all of said property except the $NW_{\pi}^{\frac{1}{4}}$ of $SW_{\pi}^{\frac{1}{4}}$ of Section 15, and cultivated part of it each and every year until the time of his death. The $NW_{\pi}^{\frac{1}{4}}$ of Section 15 came to me by inheritance of my father, R. M. Bailey.

On February 8, 1910, Sara P. Lowery, Mattie J. Newsom, Lucrecia Rutherford and Ethel Bailey, who were the sole heirs at law and next of kin of my father R. M. Bailey, except myself, deeded to me and my husband the forty last above described and this deed is recorded in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama in Deed Book 243 at page 244.

From the date of the execution of said deed up to the time of Mr. Bird's death he and I were in actual, open, notorious, continous, exclusive, hostile and adverse possesion of said part living upon it and cultivating parts of it each and every year and after his death, I have remained in possession of the same, living upon it and having portions of it cultivated each and every year.

In 1947 I had all of the above described property set aside to me as a homestead.

My attention is called to a deed executed by G. B. Lowery and wife Ola Lowery, dated January 19, 1921 and recorded in the Probate

Office of Shelby County, Alabama in Deed Book 72 at page 501, the grantee is J. A. Beard, who is one and the same person as J. A. Bird, my husband.
